In Winnipeg's downtown core, Gordon Bell High School is probably the most culturally varied school in the city, with 58 different languages spoken by the student body. Many students have arrived as refugees from various war torn areas of the world.



Inspired by the book *A Long Way Gone* by rescued Sierra Leone child soldier Ishmael Beah, and in an effort to build bridges, a special teacher Marc Kuly initiated an after-school storytelling project whereby the immigrant students would share stories with their Canadian peers.

What he and the filmmakers discovered (and you will too) are dramatic turns and a template for breaking cultural boundaries and creating community.
