

Greene to appear at film screening

Documentary recounts reservist's amazing recovery from axe attack

A screening of an award-winning documentary on Capt. Trevor Greene, a Canadian Forces reservist who was savagely attacked in Afghanistan, will feature a live appearance by Greene himself tomorrow.

Peace Warrior will be shown at the Eric Martin Pavilion theatre in two screenings, at 6:30 p.m. and at 8:20 p.m.

The hour-long documentary, which won a Gemini award last year for best biographical documentary, chronicles how Greene was ambushed from behind and struck in the head with an axe while speaking with Afghan villagers in March 2006, and his subsequent

astonishing recovery from his near-fatal wounds.

Produced by Sara Darling of Esquimalt and Sue Ridout of Vancouver, the film is narrated by former *Will and Grace* star Eric McCormack.

Greene, who lives in Nanaimo, is learning to walk again. His short-term goal is to walk down the aisle in July as he marries his long-time fiancée, Debbie Lepore.

Greene will be on hand to answer questions following the 6:30 p.m. screening. The Q&A will be recorded and played after the 8:20 p.m. screening. The theatre is located at 2328 Trent St.
