Deborah Griffin



Deborah Griffin was a vocal music specialist with the Toronto District School Board for 22 years until her retirement in 2008. During her career in Toronto schools which

included Church Street Public School, Rose Avenue Junior Public School and John Ross Robertson Junior Public School she taught countless children how to sing, read music, compose using Orff instruments, and express themselves through movement and dance. She directed eleven musicals, wrote curriculum and made presentations at music teacher workshops. Her children's choirs competed at the Kiwanis Festival and performed at numerous festival and showcase concerts in Roy Thomson Hall, Massey Hall and the Toronto Centre for the Arts. She joined Reaching Out Through Music in September 2010 as assistant choir director and took over as choir director in January 2011. Under her leadership the choir has grown significantly in numbers and range of repertoire.

Scott Pietranglo



At the age of 27, Scott Pietrangelo has already enjoyed a wide variety of musical and theatrical experience that have taken him across the province. His professional theatrical debut was as a

warehouse boy in Oliver! (Huron Country Playhouse) at the age of 8, followed by a 10month stint in the original Toronto cast of the Hal Prince revival of Showboat (Toronto Centre for the Arts). His early ventures into film and TV included guest leads on Goosebumps, Real Kids, Real Adventures and Are You Afraid of the Dark?

Since then, he has graduated from the joint Theatre and Drama Studies Program at Sheridan College and UofT Mississauga, and has also received his Advanced Certification in stage combat with RapierWit and Fight Directors Canada. Having now established himself as a Toronto artist, Scott can frequently be seen performing at piano bars, special events and concerts in and around the GTA. Aside from his acting and piano gigs he has filled many roles in and around the theatre world. In the last few years been he has been a fight captain, fight coordinator, fight instructor assistant (Daniel Levinson), production assistant (Michael Rafter musical director, Jersey Boys Toronto cast), musical director, arranger, teacher and composer. Recent on stage credits include the Big Bopper in *The Buddy Holly Story* (Capitol Theatre, Port Hope), Horton the Elephant in Seussical The Musical (Silvermist Productions), and Bombur in the Canadian Premiere of The Hobbit (Grand Theatre, London).

newchoir is a musical group that challenges the conventional definition of a choir. newchoir is a non denominational group of about 150 singers and musicians putting their unique spin on a repertoire of modern and classic rock and pop pieces.

newchoir was founded in 2005 and has grown since then from 20 to 150 members. newchoir produces and performs two major concerts every year. newchoir's members are committed to bringing to the stage a modern choral repertoire. They aim to have fun, but are still committed to a high level of musicianship.

St James Children's Choir

The St James Children's Choir was founded in 2007 by Kirkland Adset and John Loosemore with inspiration from Jean Stilwell and soon thereafter attracted the support of Patricia Parr. Kirk and subsequently Deborah Griffin and her team have brought the choir from a small group of 15 to the group of over 50 voices that will be heard tonight, on their own and in a massed choir with newchoir.

The St James Town Children's Choir is open to all children aged seven to thirteen in the St James Town community. In weekly after-school rehearsals at St Simon's Church, the choir works on challenging repertoire, gaining skills in singing, music reading, focused listening, music appreciation, co-operation and performance.

The past year has been both challenging and exhilarating for the St James Town Children's Choir. Last week saw two performances of *Compose Yourself*, a musical play based on an encounter by today's students with giants of the musical field, from Classical to Baroque, Romantic to Renaissance.
